



HARD TO BEAT — When it comes to winning a high school dual wrestling meet, the **Brandon, FL**, wrestling program is hard to beat (1998-99 shown above). The 2007-08 team extended the school's national record to 459 consecutive dual-meet victories and extended the school's unbeaten streak to 468 dual meets, before losing a meet for the first time since 1974.



DUAL PERFECTION — In 1974 **Conyers Rockdale County, GA**, became the second wrestling team in high school history to score a perfect 72 points in a dual meet (12 weight classes). Four years later, the 1977-78 team (pictured above) turned the trick again to give the Georgia school two of the 31 times a perfect score has been tallied.





The team also registered 72 takedowns on January 31, 1989, against Kansas City Bishop Ward, KS, — fourth all time — and on January 19, 1989, the Missouri wrestling team scored 65 takedowns against Kansas City St. Pius X, MO, which ranks ninth on the all-time chart.



INDIANA POWERS — One of the most consistent high school wrestling performers of all time was **Lance Ellis** (left) of **Indianapolis Cathedral, IN**. During his career from 1986 to 1989, the Indiana standout won 177 consecutive matches, which ranks eighth all time. During his winning streak, Ellis captured four consecutive Indiana High School Athletic Association individual state championships. He became only the fourth high school wrestler in Indiana history to accomplish the feat. **Alex Tsirtsis** (left in right photo) of **Griffith, IN**, and **Blake Maurer** (right in right photo) of **Evansville Mater Dei, IN**, became the fifth and sixth four-time state champions in Indiana. Tsirtsis finished his career with victories in all 236 of his matches, which ranks second for consecutive victories.

FOUR-TIME IOWA CHAMP DOUBLES IN RODEO — Jesse Sundell of **Ogden, IA** (on top), who won four consecutive Iowa High School Athletic Association state wrestling championships from 1998 to 2001, also competes in rodeo. In fact, a rodeo injury (compound fracture of the leg) before his junior season in September 1999 cast some serious doubt on Sundell's wrestling future, but Sundell bounced back from that injury to win two more state titles. Sundell is the 11th Iowa wrestler and just the second Ogden High School wrestler to win four consecutive titles, as Jason Keenan accomplished the feat from 1992 to 1995.



TOP MATMEN — Michael Murdoch (left) of **Montrose Hill McCloy, MI**, won four consecutive Michigan High School Athletic Association state wrestling championships and had 209 career wins from 1983 to 1986. **Joe Gibbons** (top right) of **Ames, IA**, who won titles from 1978 to 1981, joined 17 other Iowa high school wrestlers who won four consecutive Iowa High School Athletic Association championships. **Doug Duell** (lower right) of **Goodland, KS**, was the first in his state to win four Kansas State High School Activities Association wrestling titles.

NEW MEXICO BROTHERS WIN NINE STATE TITLES — Brothers **Scott** (left) and **Troy** (right) Owen of **Carlsbad, NM**, collected nine New Mexico Activities Association Class AAAA state wrestling titles between them. Scott became the first New Mexico wrestler to win five state titles between 1994 and 1998, amassing a 121-1 career win-loss record along the way. Troy, a year younger, compiled a 120-7 career record and won four state titles from 1996 to 1999 in the 152-pound weight class as a freshman and a junior, and in the 160-pound weight class as a sophomore and a senior. The pair played a role in leading Carlsbad to three consecutive state titles from 1995 to 1997. Interestingly, both were coached by their father, Don Owen, who also wrestled at Carlsbad, where he was runner-up in the 145-pound weight class in the 1971 New Mexico state tournament.









HALL OF FAME WRESTLING COACHING LEGENDS — Three of the all-time greatest high school wrestling coaches are members of the National High School Hall of Fame. Ninth on the all-time high school wrestling coaching victory list is **Charles Farina** (top left), who coached at **Franklin Park Leyden, IL**, and **Chicago Gordon Tech, IL**, from 1955 to 1993. During his career, Farina compiled a 644-99-7 win-loss record for a remarkable 86.3 winning percentage. Farina was a 1987 inductee into the Hall of Fame. **Bob Siddens** (top right) from **Waterloo West, IA**, coached 11 state championship teams and 51 individuals, including **Dan Gable**. He was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1988. **William "Red" Schmitt** (bottom right) of **Granite City, IL**, won nearly 90 percent of his matches as a coach. His 602 victories ranks him 10th on the all-time list. Schmitt was a 1993 inductee into the Hall of Fame.
